# Systems of Care Initiatives utilize the Wraparound process

- Wraparound process originated from the idea that children could be best served in their community by “Wrapping” individualized services and supports around them in their home, schools, and community.



# System of Care Initiatives

## Key Components

- System of Care Values & Wraparound process
- Care Coordination & Parent Liaisons
- Provider Network
  - Traditional & Non-Traditional Services
  - Flexible Funding



# Systems of Care Initiatives utilize a Provider Network

- ATCIC is the Managed Service Organization for the System of Care Initiatives
- Partners of System of Care Initiatives create a flexible fund pool managed by the MSO
- MSO manages the funds and the Provider Network to ensure a balance of traditional and non-traditional providers
- System of Care Initiatives utilize the Provider Network to support the needs of children and families, as identified in their individualized plans

# Systems of Care Initiatives utilize The Clinical Manager (TCM)

- The Clinical Manager (TCM) is the software system utilized by the Systems of Care Initiatives to manage the family record
- TCM allows for the collection of demographic information, the development of individualized plans and service utilization

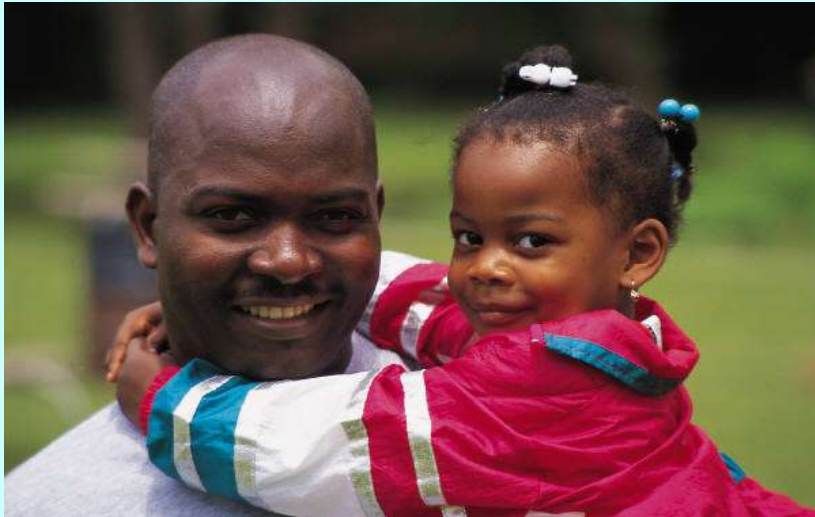

# CPC Mission

To create a single point of community collaboration for children and youth with complex needs



**CPC** is a community meeting that connects families to existing community resources based on their eligibility

# CPC MEMBERS

- Comprised of committed public and private community representatives and **families**, who bring their expertise and resources to create a continuum of care for children and families.



# CPC Status & Capacity



- CPC meetings held twice a month at host agencies: ACGC and LifeWorks
  - 15 to 20 community members attend each meeting
- Family and Youth attend to tell their story and actively collaborate on the development of their plan
- 2009 Calendar year facilitated 27 sessions
  - 10 sessions a month
  - 127 Families

# CPC Bridge Services

- Provided to families who participate in the CPC process that
  - Require Care Coordination but are not eligible through a current System of Care Initiative
  - Eligible for and on the wait list for **The Children's Partnership** but require immediate intervention and support
  - Require additional service dollars to be maintained in the community by one of the CPC partner agencies



# CPC Bridge Service Capacity

- 2009 Calendar year served 58 youth and their families
  - 1 full time coordinator
    - Serves up to 5 families from TSD
  - 2 staff that serve overflow families
    - CRCG/Juvenile Court
    - CPC Chair
- All referrals for enrollment come through CPC





The Children's Partnership unites resources so children with complex needs can live successfully with their families in the community.

TCP adheres to the System of Care values and utilizes the Wraparound process in working collaboratively with families.



# The Children's Partnership serves families using the Wraparound process facilitated by Care Coordinators & Parent Liaisons

# TCP Status & Capacity



## Status

- 2009 Calendar year served 128 youth and their families
- All referrals for enrollment come through CPC
- 13 Care Coordinators from 8 agencies
  - 6 Care Coordinators are p/t with TCP
  - 7 Care Coordinators full time TCP
  - \*\*1 Care Coordinator position vacant
- 3 Parent Liaisons

## Capacity

- TCP has limited expansion capacity
  - Targeted expansion to Partner Agencies
    - Developmental Disabilities
    - Transitional Youth
  - Service Dollars required with any expansion



# Parent Liaisons

- Parents of children with complex needs who have successfully navigated systems
- Family Voice
- Child and Family Team Members
- Provide these supports to families
  - Education
  - Support
  - Advocacy
  - Modeling
  - Systems Navigation & Linkage to community resources



# TRIAD



TRIAD is a program designed to provide funding, interagency coordination, and access to residential treatment services for children who cannot be safely maintained in the community with traditional and non-traditional supports.

# TRIAD Status & Capacity

## Status

- 2009 Calendar year enrolled 7 youth and discharged 16
- All referrals for enrollment come through CPC
- TCP care coordinator designated to serve TRIAD youth
- Families participate in the Wraparound process before, during and after placement
- Local facilities used that focus on short-term service and significant family involvement
- Serves Travis County youth who are not adjudicated through TCJPD or in CPS custody. Family income less than 200% of FPL.

## Capacity

- TRIAD's service capacity is based on:
  - Available funding
  - Placement Options



# Youth and Family Assessment Center

- YFAC has 3 programs and *no Center*
  - YFAC Wrap provided by Communities In Schools at 12 AISD schools: **Dobie, Kealing, Martin, Mendez, and Webb Middle Schools, and Allison, Andrews, Harris, Oak Springs, Ortega, Rodriguez, Zavala Elementary Schools.**
  - YFAC Supportive Services provided by the Social Work staff at the Travis County Community Centers
  - YFAC School Readiness Camps provided in conjunction with CIS, 4-H program and AISD

# YFAC Status

## Status

- 2009 fiscal year served 179 youth and their families
- Referrals for enrollment come through:
  - AISD IMPACT Teams for CIS Care Coordinators
  - Travis County Community Centers for Supportive Services
  - CIS Program Managers for Camp
- Coordinators
  - 6 Care Coordinators with CIS
  - Social Work staff @ Community Centers



# YFAC – Supportive Services Status

- 2009 fiscal year served 34 children/youth and their families
- All referrals for enrollment come through Travis County Community Centers
- Services for 3 to 9 months
- Targeted intervention: parent coach, therapy, tutoring and case management
- Serves all ages but majority of referrals are pre-school - elementary
